Starting from London hotel, we will travel to Birmingham for our 1st match. Followed by a couple of matches in North London. Then again we've to play a match against Stoneleigh CC near Birmingham. Next day, we travel up north to Manchester for a T20 against Woodhouses CC. Then, we head back down south to play 2 more matches in London. The 7 COMPETITIVE MATCHES played during the course of 12-DAY TOUR will provide our touring boys with immense confidence and experience.

During the entire travel, our boys will experience the English culture in and out while witnessing each British city closely. More importantly, interested boys can visit & explore 4 iconic stadiums like Lord's & KIA Oval Cricket Ground, London Olympic Stadium, Edgbaston & Men United Stadiums during the tour.

Luton Caribbean Cricket Club

Luton Caribbean Cricket Club is a well-respected and vibrant club at the heart of the community. Known for its friendly and sociable spirit, the club has proudly carried the Caribbean cricketing tradition in Luton for over half a century. It is carrying the Legacy of Caribbean Cricket in Luton with Caribbean roots since 1965, beginning with the Caribbean Cavaliers. It has carried forward the passion for the game, with challenges in attracting and retaining players.

In the winter of 1993, members of International and Chevette came together to secure the future of Caribbean cricket in the town. The outcome was the merger that created Luton Caribbean Cricket Club (LCCC) in 1994. The club's badge, designed by Calvin (Terry) Gooding, became a proud symbol of this new chapter.

From its foundation, LCCC has been committed to giving players from all backgrounds the opportunity to enjoy the game of cricket. Today, the club competes across three leagues:

Lords Four Counties League

Bedfordshire Invitational Saturday League

Bedfordshire Youth League

There are variety of Sunday friendly matches, keeping the social side of cricket alive.

In partnership with local organisations, LCCC runs educational & vocational courses for young people. These programmes provide pathways to skills, qualifications and employment opportunities, reinforcing the club's role as more than just a cricket team — but a cornerstone of the community.



Little Berkhamsted Sahibs CC

Founded in 1883, Little Berkhamsted CC are a friendly & welcoming club who play in the picturesque village of Little Berkhamsted with two teams on a Saturday in the Saracens Hertfordshire Cricket League & one team on a Sunday in the North Herts Cricket League.

Little Berkhamsted Sahibs Cricket Club (LBSCC) was about to fold as was Chaseville CC (both based in North London/Hertfordshire). LBSCC after establishing themselves in the late 1800's looked like it was nearing the end of an era. The team at Chaseville also being in a difficult situation decided the best option was for all the players to move over to LBSCC - where they had their own grounds and clubhouse.

LBSCC recruited lots of new players that season and for the first time produced a 2nd team. It was a great season with the 2nds winning their division and the 1sts finishing mid table only due to a points penalty received for some admin errors :(- missing out on 2nd place. At the end of the season for various reasons - retirement, relocation etc LBSCC lost a lot of its long-standing members. At the AGM some real legends of the club stepped down and all the official's positions were handed over to the younger generation. LBSCC is located in a small village, where we promise one of the best teas supplied by our local pub and long-standing member (The beehive), a beautiful ground and just overall a great place to play cricket! LBSCC actively engage with the community and building bridges with the village to really make this club a home for all.



Stoneleigh CC

Stoneleigh Cricket Club is one of the oldest cricket clubs in Warwickshire, England. It was voted by Wisden Cricketer the most beautiful ground in England in 2003.

The club was formed in 1839 by Lord Chandos Leigh, 1st Baron Leigh and the ground was established in front of the West Wing of Stoneleigh Abbey for the benefit of his sons William Henry Leigh and Edward Chandos Leigh so that they might continue to play cricket in the summer on returning home from Harrow School.[1]

One of the oldest fixtures recorded is a match played between Stoneleigh CC v Harrow School in 1847 at Harrow. A match was played against Rugby School in 1849 at Rugby School. This match is still annually played between Stoneleigh CC and Rugby School. Fixture Cards dated 1868 and 1869 are still with the club. Today the club is a thriving club with a Junior Team now established. Set in the rich and verdant Warwickshire countryside and within the grounds of the striking Stoneleigh Abbey, can be found the glorious wicket of Stoneleigh Cricket Club. It is one of the oldest and most picturesque cricket clubs in Warwickshire fielding Saturday First XI in Division 2 of the Cotswold Hills League, a Saturday Second XI playing in Division 4 of the Cotswold Hills League. Similarly, the Sunday First XI play in Division 2 of the Arden Sunday Cricket League. They also arrange a full set of fixtures for Sunday Friendly side like for Enthusiasts Sports Group in 2026.



Woodhouses CC

Woodhouses Cricket Club is a small village club located in the heart of Manchester with a big cricketing legacy and competing in the GMCL cricket league. It has a rich history in the National Village Cup, having proudly reached the semi-finals multiple times and achieving the ultimate triumph in 2011 at Lord's Cricket Ground. Woodhouses CC offers a welcoming community, competitive cricket & a true passion for the game. It is investing in better facilities, equipment & opportunities for players of all ages. This partnership isn't just a bout cricket, it's about keeping the heart of our village thriving.

Michael Arthurton's Club

Woodhouses CC is the official club of Micheal Arthurton, former England Test Captain as he started playing for this club after watching his father play. As a new player, Alan Atherton (Mike Arthorton's father) joined the Club mid-way through the season in 1960's. In his first game for the Club, Alan brought his wife Wendy and their young son, Michael, who was 5 years at the time. He avidly watched the game and his father playing for Woodhouses CC. In the early days for the Club's juniors he would struggle to get the ball off the square but what he may have lacked in power he certainly made up for in technique, skill and application. He made his debut for the Club under 13's at the age of seven, Manchester Schools under 11's at eight and Lancashire under 13's at 10. He was an outstanding performer at all the different age group levels. At the age of 14 in 1982 he made his senior debut for Woodhouses 1st X1 and played in 7 consecutive matches. His 7 innings that season yielded 230 runs at an average of 32.86 and his top score was 81. This spoke volumes for Michael who was still very much on the small side for his age.

Farokh Engineer's 1st Overseas Club

Upon hearing the County were no longer retaining the services of their wicket-keeper batsman Farokh Engineer, Arthur quickly made contact with Farokh and entered into personal negotiations for a contract with Woodhouses CC. The signing of the Indian and Lancashire CCC star by a small village cricket club aroused a good deal of media interest. He was an instant success with members and players alike through his charm and personality particularly with the ladies of the club! He eventually made his debut for the club on 1st May 1977 in the First Round of the Walkden Cup at Moorside. The crowd including many from Woodhouses CC must have considered it worth waiting for because the ex-Lancashire batsman scored a cultured 64 on a seamer's paradise. He made an impressive start to the season and late in June he was re-signed for the following season. He went on to score, for his proven ability, a modest total of 775 runs at an average of 36.9. At no stage did he ever find it difficult to score runs even on difficult seamers wickets because of his excellent footwork. His best knock of the season was again on a difficult wicket at Moorside when he scored a marvellous 131 not out from a total of 234-6.



Stoneydown Park CC

Stoneydown Park Cricket Club is located at Stoneydown Park, London, E17 7DP, United Kingdom. The club operates through the Play-Cricket platform, which is the standard online management system for cricket clubs in the UK under the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB). The club is associated with the National Cricket League (NCL), as indicated by team listings in league directories. While there is a separate entity named Stoneydown Park which is a primary school in Walthamstow sharing the same local area, the cricket club is a distinct sporting organization.



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
